By sharing your home and offering guidance to your student, your family becomes an important part of their life. Visiting students live with a host family, attend regular classes at Nackawic High School, and participate in extracurricular and community activities. A host family does not need to have a child who currently attends NHS. Many grandparents, single adults and empty nesters have volunteered to host students. There is also a financial incentive of approximately \$800/month to help compensate for the extra expense of welcoming a guest for an extended period.
