### HORIZON PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

Horizon Health Network has launched a primary care strategy to introduce collaborative Family Health Teams, enhancing the delivery of care and improving access for New Brunswickers. Instead of being matched with a a single provider, New Brunswickers will eventually be matched to a Family Health Team in their community, ensuring they can access the right health care from the right practitioner, at the right time.

The goal of a Family Health Team is to provide primary care services to patients within five days, either virtually or in person. This will ensure all New Brunswickers have equal access to high-quality care, no matter where they live in the province.

A Family Health Team includes a range of health care practitioners who bring different competencies, skills and experiences to address the diverse needs of the patients they serve. Each team includes different staff based on the size and health needs of their community. From Nurses to Social Workers to Dietitians to Physiotherapist to Pharmacists and more.

Horizon is working closely with primary care providers nearing retirement age to help them transition their current patients to a Family Health Team. This will ensure patients continue to have access to care and the NB Health Link Patient registry does not continue to grow.
